President's Column – Chaos International

On the international scene, President Trump has continued to cause chaos. On the plus side, he and his team have finally managed to bring a halt to the fighting in Gaza, and a final peace process could be in sight. On the negative side, he seems to be bringing pressure on Ukraine to basically surrender to the Russian invasion – peace at any price, one might say.

Back home, we continue to battle on. Luiz Bispo has continued his series of webinars, the latest one entitled '*Global Democracy for Global Peace*' taking place on October 20th. Speakers included Elsie Mulindi from Democracy Without Borders, Luis Cabrera from Griffith University, and Rosa Green from the Hague University. See later for a full description of the event.

As noted last issue, there have been some changes at our associate organization the Institute for Global Peace and Sustainable Governance (IGPSG). Zeny Edwards has stepped down as Chairperson, and at the recent AGM David DelosReyes was elected as Chairperson, Mai Ni Pham and Keith Suter were elected as Vice-Chairs, and Jason Lijuwardi has taken on the roles of General Secretary and Director of Operations. Charlene Cai was elected Director for Legal & Community Engagement, while Zeny retained a position as Director for International Engagement. We must give Zeny our warmest thanks for all the energy and commitment she has given both our organizations over the past few years. The IGPSG committee has continued to organize the Model Global Parliament program this yearat school level. David and Jason have recently insisted that the IGPSG should now remain an entirely separate organization from the WCAA, to which we must concur.

Our associated transnational working group, the Coalition for a World Security Community (CWSC) has had to give up its 'D10' campaign for the time being, following the Trumpian fiasco at the last G7 Summit in Canada. We are looking around for a new focus for our campaign, in which context the new 'Coalition of the Willing' to aid Ukraine is of great interest. Again, see later in the Bulletin for more on this.

Finally, we are now gearing up for the visit of Bob Flax in January next year. Bob was formerly Executive Director of the Citizens for Global Solutions in the US, and is a big wheel in the World Federalist Movement, see below for more details.

Our umbrella organization recently held the 2025 WFM/IGP Congress. Effective, cohesive, and inclusive global governance is needed more than ever to address today's turbulent times and tomorrow's challenges, according to members of the World Federalist Movement (WFM) meeting at their biennial Congress on November 1 and 2, 2025.

Congress participants discussed implementation of existing programs on international law and global governance, and adopted new policies to support and strengthen current global governance mechanisms including the United Nations, International Court of Justice and International Criminal Court, and to promote adoption of additional global governance mechanisms to safeguard the human rights of current and future generations, prevent corruption, build sustainable peace, protect the environment and manage Artificial Intelligence.

Zoom working group meeting October 8/9th, 2025

Strategy Discussions

There was general agreement that the failure of the G7 Summit in Canada signalled the end of our *D10 campaign*, at least for the duration of the Trump administration.

There was no agreement on what should come next. Chris presented his argument that the *Coalition of the Willing* on Ukraine presented a new possible basis for our Community, but others objected.

Austin argued that such a group of Western nations would be seen as aggressors by the rest of the world, and referred to a speech by Gustavo Petro Urrego, President of Colombia, at the UN.

Didier remarked that the COW has no fixed structure and limited aims, and the members are unlikely to agree to anything more. Some sort of economic partnership might be a better starting point?

Titus remarked that climate change might be a better basis for a community rather than security. He has since distributed a very interesting discussion (see at end).on his proposal for a *Global Climate Coalition*, a concept originally developed by **Chris Layton**, a former Chef De Cabinet in the European Community, based on his experience of how six countries laid the foundation for the EU. This is exactly the same strategy as ours! Titus will follow up further on this idea.

Didier reported that a policy platform has been drafted for Colombe Cahen-Salvador in her campaign as candidate for the UN Secretary-General's position. We shall watch her progress with interest.

The World is My Country https://www.theworldismycountry.com/ is a documentary that presents the extraordinary true story of Garry Davis, a Broadway actor who became a WWII bomber pilot and then went on to give up his national citizenship and become the first official World Citizen, starting the World Citizens movement and drawing in people like Albert Einstein, Albert Camus and a cast of thousands into an amazing journey that Martin Sheen calls "a roadmap to a better future." The film will be following by a discussion (80 minute film plus 30 minute Q & A).

Creating a Global Democracy for a Peaceful, Just and Sustainable World Community

In today's world, all of our major problems have gone global; including war, terrorism, environmental crises, economic calamities, pandemics, and social injustice. Many of our human-made systems are global as well. However, the one significant thing that has not gone global is democracy. Could that be the cause of our global problems? This stimulating presentation will describe an alternative way to govern our world, where "We the people" are in charge. Many scholars and laypeople agree that only a global democracy can meet today's toughest challenges. We'll explore the history of this idea,

the movement that grew out of it, the paths to getting there, and how it might work (45 minute presentation plus 30 minute Q & A).

Thank you for the endorsement of World Citizens Association of Australia for the Joint Appeal for Nuclear Abolition Day, September 26. We are thrilled at the number, breadth and diversity of endorsements. Nore than 560 organizations and 1100 individuals from 98 countries, covering all regions of the world, endorsed the appeal (see the list of countries below). Endorsing organizations are from a range of fields including peace, disarmament, human rights, environment, sustainable development, youth and faith-based organizations. Endorsing individuals come from all walks of life – including parliamentarians, local body representatives, religious leaders, Nobel Laureates, former government ministers and UN officials, academics/scientists, medical professionals, youth leaders, business leaders, educators, retirees and more.

The appeal was presented to UN member States at the <u>UN High-Level Plenary Meeting on September 26</u> by **Dr. Deepshikha Kumari Vijh**, Executive Director of the <u>Lawyers Committee on Nuclear Policy</u> and Coordination Team Member of <u>NuclearAbolitionDay.org</u>. Dr Vijh was one of only two civil society representatives invited by **Annalena Baerbock**, President of the UN General Assembly, to speak at the High-Level Session. The other civil society speakers was **Satoshi TANAKA**, Executive Board member of Nihon Hidankyo, the Japan Confederation of A- and H-Bomb Sufferers Organizations that won the Nobel Peace Prize last year.

However, we will continue campaigning on the key calls made in the Joint Appeal. Finally, we inform you that we will also have an opportunity to present the Joint Appeal to the First Committee of the UN General Assembly on October 17. This committee, which includes representatives from all UN Member States, considers disarmament resolutions for adoption by the UNGA. The Joint Appeal will remain open for further endorsement until then.

We have been in contact with the *United Nations Association of Australia – NSW Division* to explore the possibility of coordinating a joint event next year. In the meantime, we will look into opportunities for collaborative activities in the lead-up to that event.



Bangladesh Aid Project: Building Hope in Char Khabulia

For over 15 years, the World Citizens Association of Australia (WCAA) has brought education and hope to the children of Char Khabulia, a remote and flood-affected village in northern Bangladesh. Despite losing their original school to river erosion, nearly 300 children continue their studies across temporary classrooms, with many advancing to high school—an inspiring testament to community resilience and international partnership.

Beyond education, WNAF's community development efforts—including healthcare, disability support, women's empowerment, and skills training—reflect a shared commitment to sustainable progress. With BADRC's scholarships and WCAA's continued sponsorship, the next step is to empower youth through the creation of an Occupational and Skill Development Training Centre in Char Khabulia. This initiative will offer practical training, promote self-reliance, and open pathways to meaningful employment. WCAA invites friends, partners, and supporters to join this mission—building resilience through education and skills and turning collective vision into lasting change.
